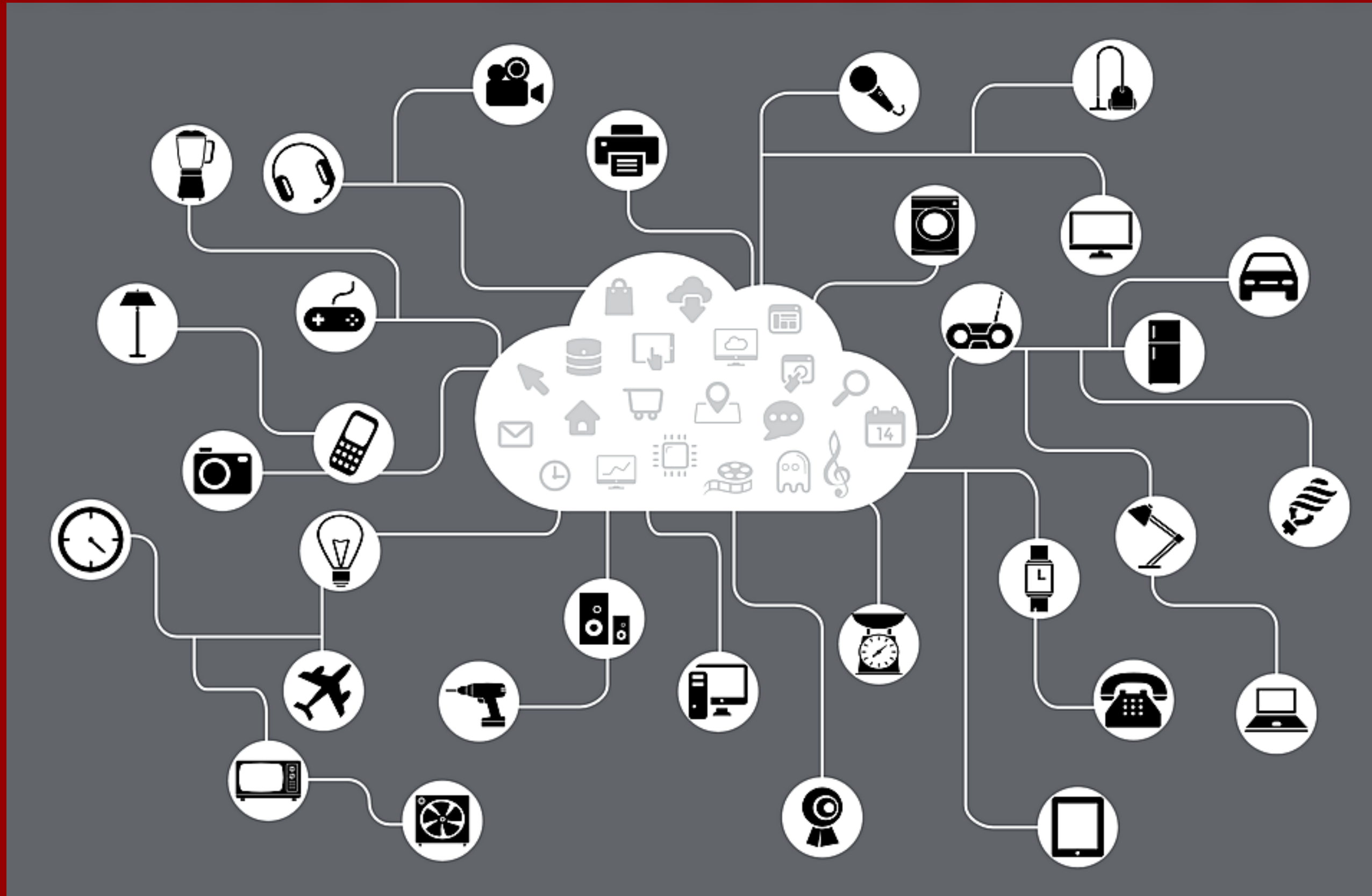

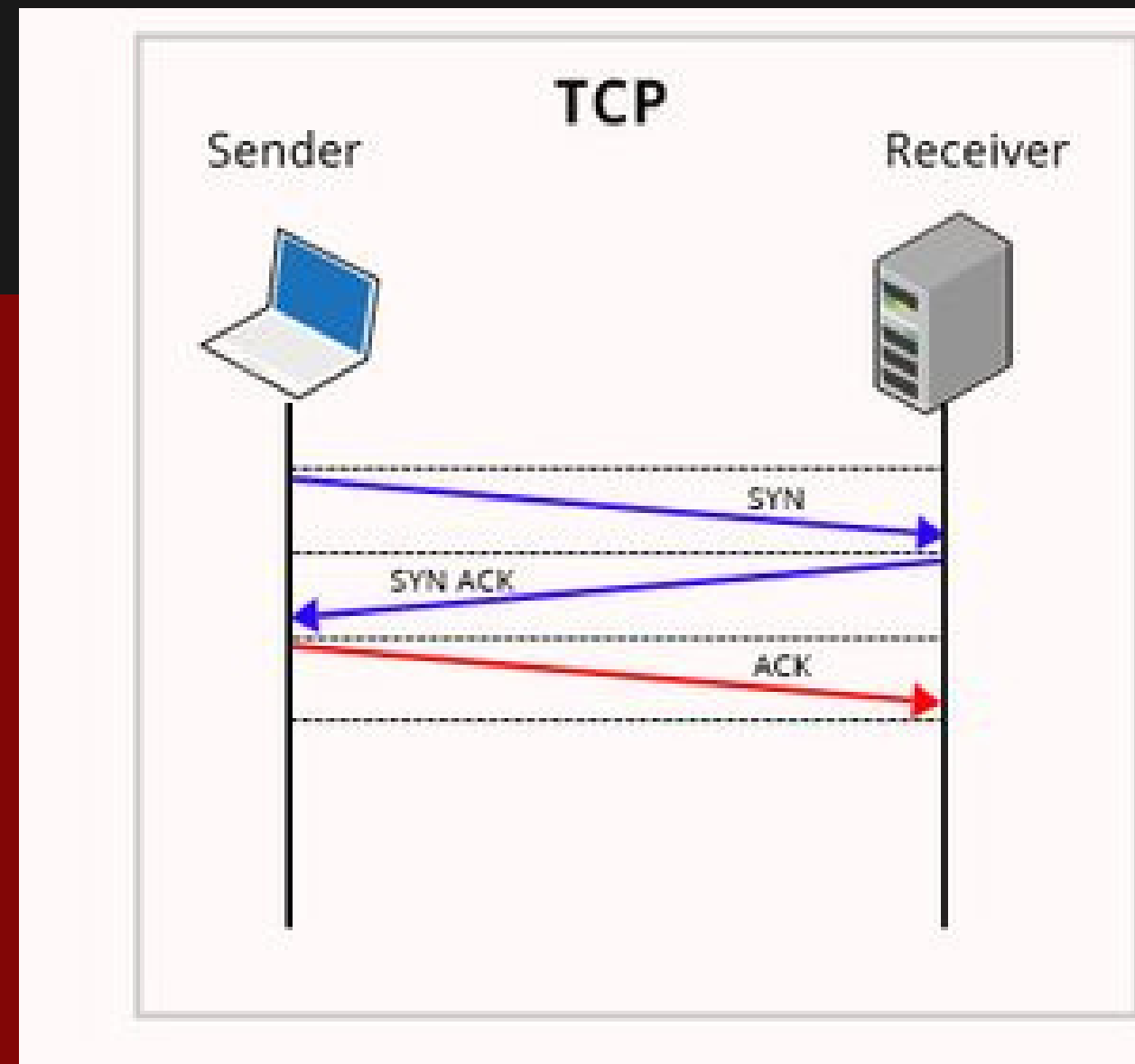

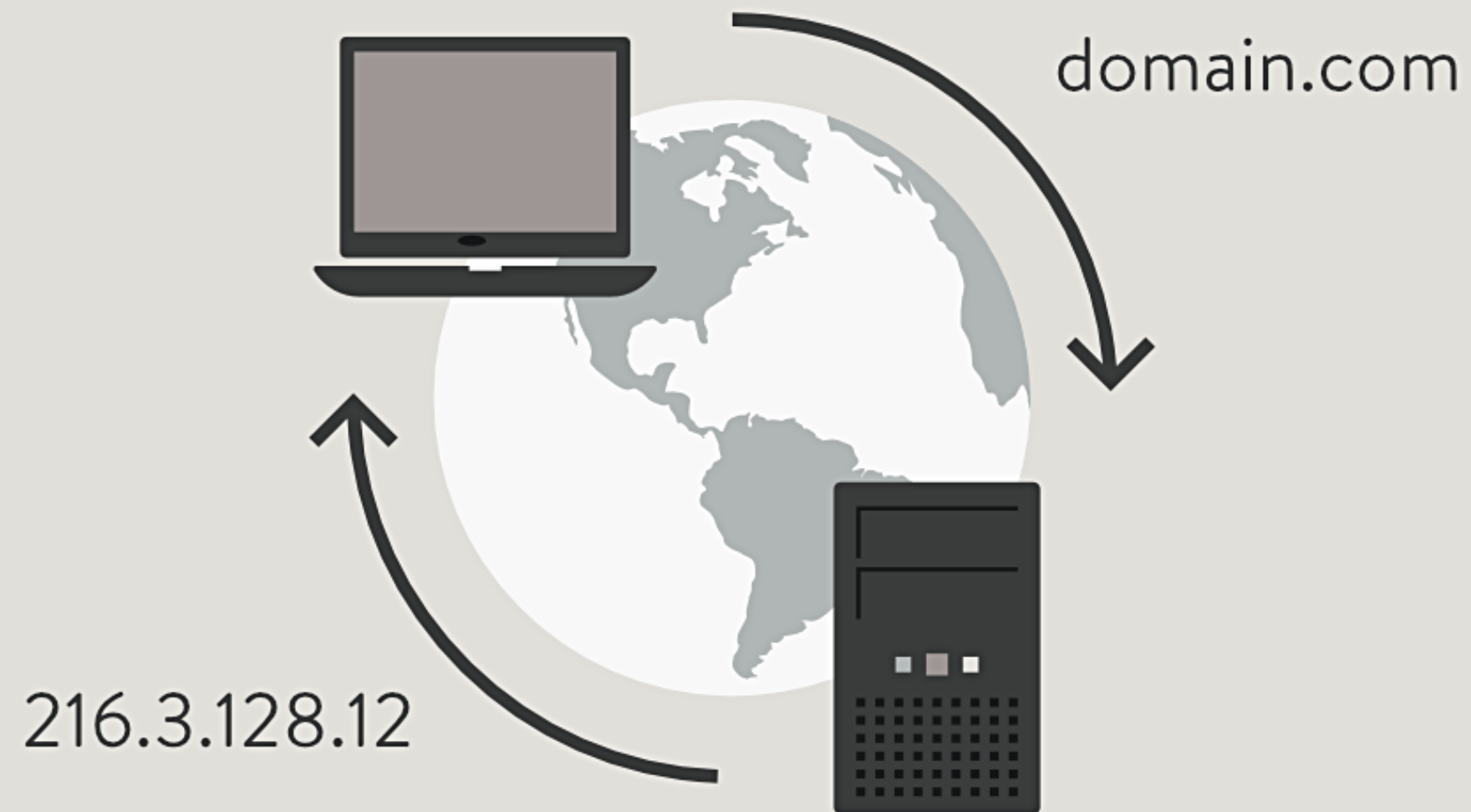

Filing a Complaint on National Cyber Crime Reporting Portal

This portal is an initiative of Government of India to facilitate victims/complainants to report cyber crime complaints online. This portal caters to complaints pertaining to cyber crimes only with special focus on cyber crimes against women and children. Complaints reported on this portal are dealt by law enforcement agencies/ police based on the information available in the complaints. It is imperative to provide correct and accurate details while filing complaint for prompt action.

Cyber Appellate Tribunal

Established under the Information Technology Act under the aegis of Controller of Certifying Authorities (C.C.A.).

Procedure and Powers

The principles of natural justice guide it and it is subject to other provisions of the Act. The Tribunal has powers to regulate its own procedure.

Cyber Appellate Tribunal

1. Summoning and enforcing the attendance of any person and examining him under oath.
2. Ensuring the availability of the required documents or electronic records.
3. Receiving evidence on Affidavits.
4. Issuing commissions for examining witnesses or documents.
5. Reviewing its decisions.
6. Dismissing an application for default or deciding it ex-parte, etc.
